

Resizing an Image in Lightroom


Ensure you are in the **LIBRARY** module when you are ready to export images from Lightroom




Select the image(s) to be exported. Multiple images can be batch exported in the same operation




Once you have selected your image(s) to be exported from Lightroom pick the **Export** button at the bottom left of the screen




The all important Export Dialog box makes an appearance




Select the folder that you will export your image(s) to. Generally I create the folders prior to exporting rather than creating them on the fly.



You can name your image at this point although this is not essential. Image renaming can be done at a later point in time.




Change the image settings so that the image is exported as a '.jpg' file with the 'sRGB' colour space and check the 'Limit file size' checkbox and limit the file size to 5000K (5MB)





This is the all important part for resizing the image.

Check the 'Resize to fit' checkbox and select the 'Width & Height from the drop down menu. Enter 1920 and 1080 respectively and ensure pixels have been selected. Because this method relies on the images aspect ratio the image height or width will be adjusted accordingly based on the 1920 & 1080 settings. The 'Resolution' setting is for images that are to be printed and not important for images to be displayed on a screen.




An alternate method of resizing the image is to select the 'Long Edge' method and enter the appropriate long edge dimension for either landscape or portrait mode images. The other image dimension is calculated by Lightroom based on the image aspect ratio







For any image that will be entered into a club or interclub competition ensure that the 'Watermark' checkbox is **NOT** checked.



When you are happy with all of the settings pick the **Export** button at the bottom right of the dialog box.



Lightroom displays a progress indicator at the top left of the screen. At completion of the operation the progress bar disappears.



When you have completed exporting your images you may wish to check the resulting image properties for dimensions and file size.

This is not essential but only for your own information.

As you can see below the image width has been automatically adjusted to suit the 1080 pixel image height and maintain the correct image aspect ratio from the original crop edit.
